



Property Tax

- Exemption for developments that dedicate 70+ units for affordable housing
- "Opt out" option of Live Local property tax exemption if there is a surplus of "middle-income" units (80-120%)
- Extends timeframe to start repair of damaged homesteaded property to 5 yrs

Corporate Income Tax

• Temporary tax credit for corporations that employ individuals with disabilities

Property Insurance

- One year relief from insurance premium tax and State Fire Marshal assessment for residential property insurance policies written between April 2024 – September 2025
- One year relief from insurance premium tax on flood insurance policies

Health & Human Services



HB 1365 – Unauthorized Public Camping and Public Sleeping

- Prohibits public camping/sleeping on public property begins 10/1/2024
- <u>Counties</u> may designate a site owned by the county or a city for this purpose by majority vote (if within a city, the city must also approve of the location)
- Must get site certified by DCF, provide documentation
- County must maintain minimum standards at location
- Civil cause of action begins 1/1/2025

HB 1065 – Substance Abuse Treatment

- Recommendations by PBC State Attorney Addiction Recovery Task Force
- Establishes levels of care at certified recovery residences
- Forbids residences from denying access on the basis that an individual is prescribed FDA-approved medication to assist with treatment
- Prohibits local governments from regulating length or frequency of stays

Transportation & Economic Development



SB 328 – Affordable Housing (Live Local Glitch)

- Exempts airport-impacted areas
- Preempts "floor area ratio" for qualifying developments
- Clarifies that density entitlements do not include any bonus, variance or other special exceptions
- \$100 million for Florida Hometown Hero Program

HB 479 – Alternative Mobility Funding Systems

- Requires counties and cities that charge for transportation impacts to enter into ILAs by Oct. 1, 2025 to mitigate impacts to their transportation facilities
- Requires local governments with impact fees to base its calculations on a study using data within 4 years of the current impact fee update

HB 1301 – Department of Transportation

- Small County Outreach Program Farm-to-Market Language
- Prevents transit providers from using FDOT funds for advertising activities

• Establishes new criminal penalties for tampering with critical infrastructure

 Allows for public release of grand jury testimony in 2006 case against Jeffrey Epstein

HB 7067 – Pretrial Detention Hearings

 Authorize court to base order of pretrial detention solely on hearsay if defendant was arrested for a dangerous crime where a pretrial hearing is mandatory

HB 1589 – Driving Without a Valid Driver License

 Increases penalties for driving without a license and mandates minimum jail sentences for repeat offenders

SB 7002 – Deregulation of Public Schools

 Removes regulations on school districts to provide more flexibility regarding personnel and facility planning

SB 7004 – Assessment and Accountability Deregulation

 Provides flexibility for school districts regarding state mandated instructional materials and testing



Agriculture & Natural Resources



PASSED

SB 1638 – Funding for Environmental Resource Management

- Dedicates 96% of revenues from 2021 Gaming Compact to Florida's environmental resources:
 - FL Wildlife Corridor \$100 million (26.042%)
 - Land Management & Invasive Species Removal \$100 million (26.042%)
 - Resilient FL Grants \$100 million (26.042%)
 - FL Water Quality Improvement Grants \$79 million (remainder of funds)

Amendment 1 – Partisan School Board Elections

· Starting with 2026 Primary and General Elections

Amendment 2 – Right to Hunt and Fish

Declares "A Public Right"
 Does not limit FWS authority

Amendment 3 – Recreational Marijuana

Legalizes up to 3 oz. for those 21 and over
Current dispensaries could sell

Amendment 4 – Abortion Access

- No law could restrict abortion before viability
 Parantal patification remains
- · Parental notification remains

Amendment 5 – Homestead Annual Inflation Adjustment

Applies to the \$25K exemption, between \$50-\$75K of value
Estimated impact to Local Governments: - \$22 Billion

Amendment 6 – Public Campaign Financing

• Repeals Section 7, Article VI providing for public financing of campaigns for candidates who accept spending limits
