SIGNS OF CREATIVITY

We were excited to welcome Ms. Joette Paulone this year as our instructor for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Residency during the week of May 16 – 20. As a deaf artist, Joette, has an extensive background as a director, actress, teacher, translator, ASL Instructor, teaching aide, language and literary instructor, and storyteller. Joette strives to promote self-esteem, increased awareness, and sensitivity of the Deaf culture and people of all abilities.

Joette hit the ground running and worked closely with Ryan and the School District's Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH) counselors. The team was able to put together a curriculum that satisfied many students. Joette absolutely brought out the best qualities of each of the students in each grade level. It was important to her to encourage students to use their imagination and to infuse greater meaning into their acting using facial expressions and body dynamics. The DHH Drama Residency offers students the opportunity to increase their ASL language and communication skills, including theatre, and dance based vocabulary.

Under the direction of Joette, the 4th and 5th grade students put together a wonderful play entitled, "Rainbow Fish". The positive message of sharing echoed throughout the halls of the school. It was a true testament to our amazing teaching artist and her skills in her craft.

A big thanks to the Bak Middle School of the Arts National Junior Honor Society for Dance Arts for raising \$3,000.00 at the school's annual student Dance Concert on January 28 & 29, 2022.

Our dance residency with Forest Hill Elementary School is one of several school-based performing arts programs held throughout the year. Instructor, Kali DeCarlo meets with seven self-contained Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) units once a week for 30 minutes each. Select students in grades 4 and 5, are chosen to perform at the Arts4All Florida-Palm Beach County Showcase in December and always put on a show-stopping performance. This dance residency gives students the opportunity to explore the art of dance and movement and to be a part of the creative process.

This past fall 8 students were chosen to perform at the Showcase entitled "And the Beat goes on". Ms. Kali choreographed a dance to go along with the song, "Dreamer" by Black Violin. Every week, students practiced diligently with Ms. Kali and encouraged one another to give their very best effort. Everyone was excited for the show day especially since the Showcase was virtual last year. Even the students from Bak Middle School of the Arts were excited to be on the stage again. We would like to thank Forest Hill Elementary School faculty and staff for providing ongoing support for this program and helping to make the event a very memorable day for the students and their proud parents and families. Learning about themselves, taking chances, having a growth mindset, trying new things, and having fun are the just some of the benefits of the dance residency for our very wonderful and special students.

The funds will be used for Arts4All Florida-Palm Beach County's Dance Residencies at Forest Hill Elementary, North Grade Elementary, Seminole Trails Elementary and D.D. Eisenhower Elementary schools as well as John I. Leonard High School, Palm Beach Central High School, Palm Beach Gardens High School, and Palm Beach Lakes High Schools.

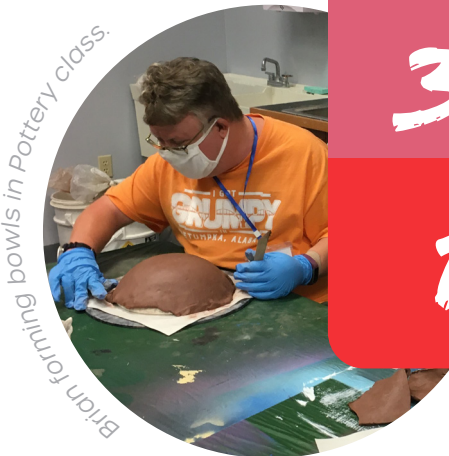

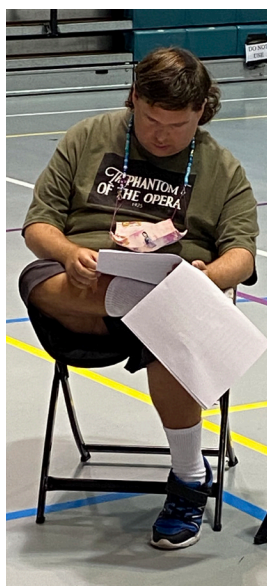

Community Theatre

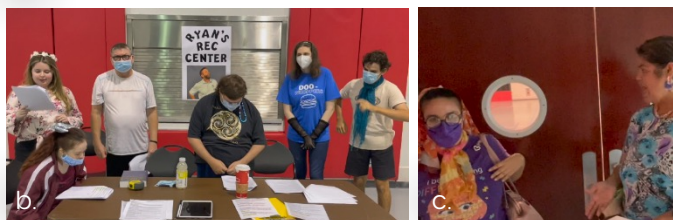

The instructors identify the strengths of the participants who audition for roles based upon their abilities and interests. The program teaches participants to work together as an ensemble in a positive and constructive way leading towards their mutual goal. This wonderful program culminated in a performance of "Perspectives" - a very entertaining and humorous original script written by instructor Kat Kenny and performed at the A4AFL-PBC Celebration of the Arts on August 5, 2022. 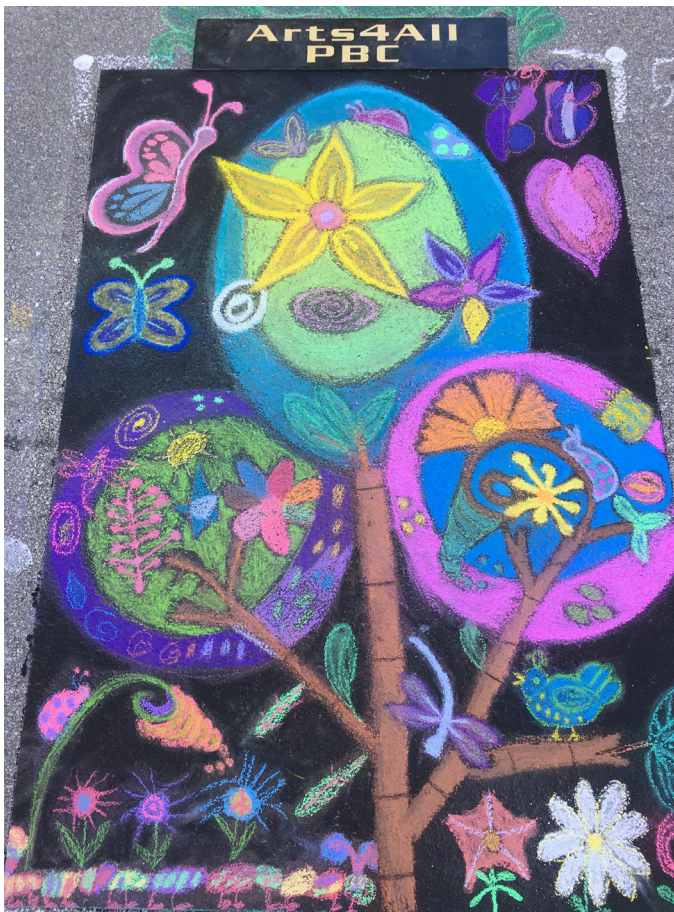

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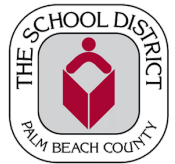
