Summary: This grant will be used to provide spay/neuter services for twenty large dogs every Monday for a one year period. Because of limited large cage space, Animal Care and Control struggles to meet the demand for large dog surgeries promptly. As a result, many of the dogs are not being sterilized which results in increased litters of unwanted puppies and/or increased numbers of large dogs surrendered to the shelter. Marmaduke Mondays will be held at the main shelter where cage capacity for this specific purpose will be established. The agreement to use the funds for large dog sterilization was signed by the Vice-Chair of the BCC because there was limited time to accept the funding. **Countywide** (SF)

Background and Justification: Florida Animal Friends (FAF), Inc. provides grants to qualified recipients with proceeds from the sale of the State of Florida (SOF) spay/neuter license plate program.

Thank you for submitting a 2011 grant application to the Florida Animal Friend (FAF), Inc. spay/neuter license plate program. Proceeds from the sale of this license plate enable FAF to offer funding to organizations providing free or low-cost spay/neuter services, in an effort to reduce pet overpopulation and save the lives of countless dogs and cats throughout the state of Florida.

The 2011 grant selection committee evaluated 48 complete applications totaling \$1,040,792. Each committee member read all of the grants and scored them in 6 categories including cost benefit ratio, track record of the applicant, and evidence of compelling need for the program. The proposals were excellent, and the committee found it very difficult to rank them in order. Ultimately, 21 grant applications were funded for a total of \$459,948.

We are pleased to announce that Palm Beach County Animal Care & Control has been selected for funding in the amount of \$25,000. Some of the applications were funded for less than requested in order to provide support for as many projects as possible.

In order to accept the FAF grant, please sign a copy of this offer letter and return it by August 10, 2011. Checks will be mailed by August 15, 2011. In signing the letter, Palm Beach County Animal Care & Control agrees to the following stipulations:

The funds will be expended only for spay/neuter services and may not be utilized for vaccinations,

Briefly describe your animal programs:

We are a full service community animal management program available 24/7 for public concerns. We respond to public requests for animal services, investigate animal cruelty and neglect, and inspect/license a variety of animal related services and/or businesses. Our main shelter is open daily for all services including adoptions, lost pet recovery, volunteering, rabies vaccinations, animal intake, etc. We have veterinary staff on duty daily and on call 24/7. We have three spay/neuter programs for privately owned pets: At our main facility in West Palm Beach, we sterilize pets daily either being reclaimed by their owners or adopted into new homes. At our West County facility, we sterilize pets Monday-Friday for privately owned pets, feral cat caregivers and rescue groups. At our Spay Shuttle, we sterilize pets Monday-Friday for privately owned pets and feral cat caregivers.

We have been providing high quality/high volume public spay/neuter services for over ten years. We have the equipment and facilities to perform this service. Our veterinary team is highly skilled and experienced. We have four veterinarians and ten veterinary technicians with most having worked in the animal care field for over ten years. Our administrative team led by Director Dianne Sauve for seven years, also has great depth in developing and directing programs to address community animal concerns. Dr. Rebecca Rhoades, Shelter Operations Manager will be directing this program and has over fifteen years of administering and performing community spay/neuter services.

If you currently have a program for sterilization of cats and/or dogs, describe your current level of funding and productivity and why additional resources are needed?

Our community spay/neuter programs are critical for us to address the homeless pet population in Paim Beach County. Fortunately in years past, we had received generous community support to fund free and low cost services for approximately 10,000 pets annually. For FY2010, our community spay/neuter programs (Spay Shuttle and West County) operated with a loss of \$275,000. The loss was funded from donations received and County funding. We are in our fourth year of budget cuts with the County and donations have not been able to continue to fill the gap. We are looking at a ten percent budget cut for FY2012 and are requesting additional resources to maintain a minimum level of services for the public. This service will include a more focused effort to reduce our most at risk animals (large dogs and cats) in our community.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs? We currently offer a variety of services at three locations as stated above on page 2. We offer low-cost services to the general public and free services for pitbulls and low-income qualified residents. There are other organizations in the community that offer services at a reduced rate but not free or for as low of cost as our subsidized programs offer. We are able to meet the demand fairly promptly (within 2 weeks) for small dogs and cats. Because of limited large dog cage space, we aren't meeting the demand promptly (2 month wait time) for large dogs (over 50lbs.) and as a result, many are having pupples or not showing up for appointments due to lag time. Our proposal is to increase our capacity for large dog surgeries once a week to meet the demand from the public requesting sterilization of their dogs.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)? Average 20 large dog sterilizations on Mondays for a one year period to meet the public demand for sterilization of large dogs.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline? Currently, we average 20 large dog surgeries per week. By increasing our capacity for 20 large dogs on Mondays and continuing the regular schedule Tuesday – Friday (average 4 large dogs daily), we would increase the number of large dogs sterilized per week by approximately 100%.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for the program?

Dogs weighing 50 lbs. or more. We currently offer free services for pitbull owners and qualified low-income residents. We qualify pet owners by proof of public support (eg. food stamps) or low income (W-2). Our low cost program is available for all other pet owners.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience. Website, radio, fliers, press releases and Craigslist. We currently do not have facebook or twitter available with the County. If this changes soon, we will utilize these social media avenues too.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

Transportation will be provided with our Neuter Commuter for those who cannot transport their dog. All promotional materials will be prepared in Spanish. Depending on demand, incentive program may be offered with our pet food bank for qualified low-income county residents.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

We currently operate two transport vehicles with trained staff: the Stray Shuttle and the Neuter Commuter. Both are animal transport vans with stainless steel caging and customized air conditioning/ventilation.

What arrangements have you made with veterinarians to perform the surgeries? We will provide services with our current veterinary team of team of 4.25 veterinarians and 10 FTE veterinary technicians.

For qualified low-income, large dog owners and pitbuli owners, they will pay no fee. For all other large dog owners, they will pay \$50. The service provided for each large dog includes the sterilization surgery, rabies vaccination, County license and microchip.

We will increase our staffing on Mondays to handle the larger dogs. Currently, we operate with one veterinarian, one veterinary technician and one animal care specialist. On Mondays, we will add one f/t animal care specialist and one p/t veterinarian.

Budget

Describe any expenses that are not included in the grant and how they will be paid for:

Based on our experience, we project 55% of the large dog owners to be low income qualified or pitbuli owners. Their fee is waived and the grant funding will cover the cost of their surgeries. Approximately 500 dogs. Other services we will fund from our field services department is the transport of large dogs for surgery with our Neuter Commuter.

Timeline

All projects must be completed within 12 months of receipt of funding. Any unexpended funds must be refunded to Florida Animal Friend within 30 days of the end of the project. Requests for time extensions must be made in writing at least 30 days prior to the end of the project. Funding for accepted projects will be available after August 1, 2009.

Future Funding

Explain how the organization plans to fund this program in the future. Having plans beyond "seeking funds from other funders" enhances the chances of receiving this grant.

Due to the difficulty in placement of homeless large dogs and the public demand for smaller dogs, future spay/neuter program funds if limited, will be targeted to curb the over production of large dogs and pitbuils. The smaller dogs may be directed to use private veterinary services or other higher cost resources if we are unable to secure funds to maintain the program after completion of this pilot 1-year program, Marmaduke Mondays.

Funding Request for Spay/Neuter Program "Marmaduke Mondays"

Dear Florida Animal Friends,

This letters serves as written support of a request for funding to launch an exciting program called "Marmaduke Mondays" at Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control. Our goal is to sterilize 20 larger sized dogs each Monday for a one-year period as part of a significant and collaborative effort in reducing euthanasia of unwanted animals.

Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control serves as a leader in innovative sterilization programs. We have superior staffing who are motivated to work as a team in targeting those animals most in need of sterilization – large dogs (and cats). Our staff is trained in high volume surgery and we have the logistical support and resources to undertake such a program.

While I must admit that I am biased in my pride as it relates to our agency, I do feel compelled to share with you some of the responsibilities and work we do in our community.

- We are the only open admission facility in Palm Beach County sheltering more than 25,000 animals annually;
- Our area of enforcement is 2,300 square miles and encompasses 37 incorporated municipalities, and all of unincorporated Palm Beach County;
- We are the only agency in Palm Beach County offering free and low-cost spay/neuter services (\$50.00 maximum current cost and includes surgery, microchip, rabies shot, tag, Frontline; all services are free to anyone on public assistance.)
- We are the only agency offering free sterilization of pit bull or pit-type dogs;
- We provide free sterilization for feral cats with a focus on spay/neuter, and care-giver release;

- We created a successful venue for high-volume sterilization of feral and friendly cats called "Op Around the Clock." This event draws volunteer veterinarians from around our geographical area in a spirit of cooperation to spay and neuter a minimum of 400 cats in a 24-hour period. This collaborative effort has fostered a new atmosphere of cooperation between the private sector veterinary community, feral cat caregivers, and governmental animal care;
- Our agency actively investigates and works tirelessly to prosecute animal cruelty;
- We were the first county in Florida to pass a law that offers financial incentives for pet sterilization and financial disincentives for owners of pets who choose not to sterilize (chaining of animals is prohibited in our county); and
- Although we are a governmental agency, we demand consistent humane care of every animal entering our shelter with a focus on freedom from stress, hunger, thirst, discomfort and fear.

It is with hope that I encourage you to assist us in funding a program that can target large dogs. The vast majority of dogs entering shelters are medium to large breeds and our existing spay/neuter program data indicates that large dog breeds are at the highest risk of unwanted pregnancy and subsequent relinquishment to shelters.

We are excited about the possibility of adding this as part of our existing programs and look forward to working with each of you.
