GRANT CONDITIONS

A. General Terms and Conditions

1. This award is subject to The Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements in 2 C.F.R. - 2. All entities that receive funds from this award must report progress in achieving performance goals at least quarterly using the PMP.

E. Payment Basis

- 1. A request for Advance or Reimbursement shall be made using the HHS/DPM system (https://pms.psc.gov/).
- 2. The grantee, must utilize the object classes specified within the initial grant application each time they submit a disbursement request to ONDCP. Requests for payment in the DPM system will not be approved unless the required disbursements have been entered using the corresponding object class designations. Payments will be made via Electronic Fund Transfer to the award recipient's bank account. The bank must be Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured. The account must be interest bearing.

3. Except for interest earned on advances of funds exempt under the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (31 U.S.C. 6501 et seq.) and the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450), awardees and sub-awardees shall promptly, but at least annually, remit interest earned on advances to HHS/DPM using the remittance instructions provided below.

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) Accept on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) Program grant in the amount of \$149,193 for the Palm Beach Narcotics Task Force, for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021; **B) Approve** a budget amendment of \$149,193 in the Sheriff's Grant Fund.

Summary: On February 24, 2020, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) received a grant award from the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) in the amount of \$149,193 for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021. There is **no match requirement** associated with this award: <u>Countywide</u> (LDC)
