MOTION AND TITLE: Staff recommends motion to approve:

A). Appointment of four members to the Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) for a 4-year term for the period May 16, 2023, to May 15, 2027.

B). an adjustment of the seat designated for the Director of a community mental health agency, which was initially filled by Darcy Davis, CEO of the Healthcare District of Palm Beach County, now to be filled by Ann Berner CEO, of Southeast Florida Behavioral Health Network (SEFBHN), who has already been appointed to the PSCC.

SUMMARY: The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) created the Palm Beach County Correctional Planning Committee, the predecessor to the Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) in 1991 by Resolution (R91-1485) and subsequently amended the Resolution to conform the terms of the Resolution required by section 951.26, Florida Statutes. On March 14, 2023, the BCC adopted a revised Resolution (R2023-0334) that designated the PSCC as the criminal justice, mental health, and substance use planning council required by section 394.657, Florida Statutes. The Public Safety Coordinating Council is comprised of a minimum of 23 members. The Board currently has 18 seats filled and a diversity count of Caucasian: 13 (57%), African-American: 2 (9%) and Hispanic: 3 (13%). The gender ratio (female:male) is: 9:9. The nominees are 2 Caucasian females, 1 African American male, and 1 African American female. **Countywide (HH)**

BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION: In 1991, the BCC enacted Resolution (R91-1485), which established the Palm Beach County Correctional Planning Committee. (Continued on page 3)

Thereafter, in 1992, the Board approved Resolution (R92-1803) changing the title of the "Palm Beach County Correctional Planning Committee" to the "Palm Beach County Public Safety Coordinating Council" pursuant to Chapter 92-310, Laws of Florida that renamed the Council. With Resolution (R92-1803), the BCC also authorized the BCC to be represented on the PSCC by its Chair or another County Commissioner. Lastly, Resolution (R2008-1787) added language consistent with section 951.26, Florida Statutes. On March 14, 2023, the BCC adopted a resolution, (R2023-0334), adding language to ensure consistency with sections 951.26 and 394.657, Florida Statutes, and designating the PSCC as the criminal justice, mental health, and substance use disorder planning council required by section 394.657, Florida Statutes, which placed the County in a position to apply for state funding through the Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Program, when available. With this board appointment, 22 of the 23 seats on the PSCC will be filled.
