Summary: On February 26, 2024, the Youth Services Department issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for Community Based Agencies (CBA) funding for three (3) years, beginning in FY2025. Proposals were accepted for three (3) action areas identified as priorities in the Youth Master Plan (YMP): Economic Access, Parenting and Role Models, and Educational Supports. To continue to align programs with the YMP and incorporate evidence-based/promising programming with outcomes and performance measures, the NOFO was issued. Final contracts with each Action Area Agency will be presented to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) after contract negotiations are complete. After completion of each contract year, a report will be developed detailing each CBA's progress in meeting their performance measurements. Countywide (HH)

Background and Policy Issues: The NOFO was issued for three (3) Action Areas. The proposed contract awards under this NOFO total \$1,420,910.00, annually for three (3) years. The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approved a Contract with Forum for Youth Investment Corp. on December 15, 2015, for the creation of a collaborative YMP, which was published in November 2016 and presented to the BCC in a workshop on January 24, 2017, along with the recommended funding areas. The YMP identified six (6) priority areas. For FY2025, three (3) Action Areas were selected for funding pursuant to the issuance of the NOFO. The Economic Access Action Area includes building education to employment pathways for opportunity youth. The Parenting and Role Models Action Area increases outreach to parents through communications, natural support system network, and parent mentors. The Educational Supports Action Area promotes equitable access to and success in higher education for pre-K through post-secondary students, by increasing parent, community, and business involvement in education. A total of thirty-six (36) proposals were received. The proposals were initially reviewed for responsiveness. Two (2) proposals were deemed non-responsive due to failure to submit required documentation before the deadline, and one (1) proposal was deemed nonresponsive due to failure to upload the most recent Independent Audit report and Total Agency Budget. Proposals meeting minimum requirements were reviewed by a separate Review Panel for each Action Area, and consisted of community and subject-matter The Review Panels scored the proposals based on the following criteria: experts. Description of Need, Local Data, Approach and Design, Evaluation Methods, Performance History, Available Resources and Sustainability, and Budget. The Review Panels also ranked proposals based on the priority and criticality of the services in the community. The YSD Director made the final recommendations utilizing each Review Panel's scoring and ranking, knowledge of other funding availability and a review of budget needs and available resources.

Pursuant to BCC direction, a protest process was included with this NOFO. One protest was filed by Florence Fuller Child Development Centers, Inc., regarding the missed deadline for submission of the application. The protest was denied.

Twenty (20) proposals are being recommended for funding.
